The world's largest catamaran fits perfectly at a Queensland marina, which has been dredged and upgraded to provide superyacht facilities in the heart of the Whitsundays and Great Barrier Reef.

The world's largest luxury catamaran, S/Y HEMISPHERE has found a fitting base this week in the heart of the Great Barrier Reef.

The 44-metre catamaran, with 16.6metre beam has been easily accommodated within Airlie Beach's Abell Point Marina, of the region which is attracting growing numbers of superyachts.
